First initial consultation

This can either be at our offices, at your home, or over the telephone - whichever suits you best. It's likely to last around one hour, but may be longer depending upon your individual circumstances.

Completing the Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA)

At our first meeting we'll listen to your concerns and complete the relevant LPA(s) which you and your attorneys will need to sign. Our wills and probate solicitor will act (in most circumstances) as your Certificate Provider. They'll have the right to declare that you have the requisite mental capacity to make a lasting power of attorney.

Registration

Once all the forms have been completed, (which should take no more than five working days, unless we advise you otherwise) we'll apply to register your LPA(s) with the Office of the Public Guardian (OPG). This takes approximately two months. We'll contact you as soon as it has been returned by the OPG for you to collect it and store it safely at home.

Payment

We kindly request that you pay our fees as soon as the LPA has been registered.
